Board President's Note

I'm writing this after our March Board Meeting. I think we all left tonight feeling the spirit of wellbeing after accomplishing something significant. Together we put our values in front of us as we collaborated to make sure that we are building a stronger community. Unanimously we decided that all of our bathrooms should be gender neutral. This may include some changes other than signage, including possibly adding some stalls to enclose the urinals in one restroom. We will work to make this an easy transition for us all. We also are asking Facilities Committee to work towards making a bathroom ADA compliant on the Religious Education side of the church.

Unanimously we agreed to put more money into childcare so that we can offer childcare for parents to attend committee meetings. Next year we hope all meetings will be held on Monday and Wednesday evenings when childcare, if needed, can be shared by several committees. If you are a chair of a committee or team, please plan ahead for these two days. We plan to have child care starting at 5:00.

We decided unanimously to offer registration to three delegates to attend General Assembly in New Orleans June 21st to 25th. If you want to be a delegate, please contact me as soon as possible and **no later than April 10**.

We are also educating ourselves about what it means to be a sanctuary church and what it means to be a teaching congregation. We are in the very, very earliest period of fact finding, but I want you to know so that if you hear words sprinkled in conversations, that you will know that we are just gathering facts.

In speaking with Jerry and Selma Blackburn after being inducted to the Cornerstone Society, it became evident that not only is UUCLR strong because their spirit was guiding us for over 50 years, but that they are strong because they attended UUCLR for 50 years. Everything we put into this church shapes it and comes back to help make us be the authentic person we want to be. I am so glad your spirit is part of this congregation!

Both traditions evolved to draw from the teachings of world religions and to emphasize social justice. 2017 Buffalo River Camping and Canoe Trip

The UUCLR Memorial Day trip to the Buffalo River is a wonderful time of camping, fellowship, and fun on the river for all - except the beleaguered organizer who is trying to find canoes, match up partners, outfit everyone with a life jacket and paddles, and collect last minute payments. This year, so that everyone, including the organizer, has a fun and safe weekend, **there will be some IMPORTANT changes:**

1. Anyone may camp, right up to the weekend - cost is \$8 for each adult 18 years or older per night. The UUCLR organizer will still collect the fees and pay the U.S. Park Service. Please pay this person in advance, if possible. Juggling money and making change can be tough while in a bathing suit.
2. Cabin reservations are the responsibility of individuals.
3. **If you want to go on the river, all canoes/kayaks/shuttle reservations for Saturday and/or Sunday are to be made directly with Dirst Canoe Rentals.** Their phone numbers are 800-537-2850 or 870-449-6636. **UUCLR will no longer be responsible for canoe reservations.**
Warning: Canoes can be scarce on this popular weekend, so please do not wait past May 1 to make your reservation - the sooner the better. Tell Dirst you are part of the UUCLR group so that you will be included for the shuttle busses. You do not have to rent from Dirst, but coordination may be more difficult if you pick a different company.
4. Potluck at the Pavilion is on Saturday, starting at 5:30pm. A grill is available if you wish to bring charcoal. Bring your own plates, cups, utensils, something to drink, and a dish to share. Take away all your dirty dishes, left over food, and trash. It is **pack in/pack out**. We ask \$4/adult to cover pavilion costs. This should be paid ahead of time.

The biggest change is the shifting of all responsibility for canoe rentals to individuals. No float money will be collected by UUCLR.
